Rebuilding our communities after a catastrophic disaster like the recent Chilean earthquake or the Japan earthquake and tsunami will require unprecedented teamwork among designers, engineers and planners from both the public and private sectors.



This interactive workshop at NOAA's Sandpoint facility will bring together engineers, planners, and emergency managers from around the region to begin talking about how we would rebuild our transportation and utilities infrastructure after a catastrophic disaster. Building on lessons learned from successful and not-so-successful recoveries, this workshop will ask attendees to develop common recovery objectives after a hypothetical catastrophic incident, consider prioritizing recovery investments, and develop concepts for how an infrastructure recovery effort might be organized for

the Puget Sound region.
