Scribe Report

Heading to 2009's first ITE Washington section meeting, I was quite impressed with the new (to me) Lynnwood Convention Center. Starting with large areas of glass and modern architectural designs on the outside, the interior continued its feel save the lack of a lodging section. Even before going into the large meeting rooms, I couldn't help notice the open hallway areas for all the potential meetings after the meeting. With such an attractive gathering venue, I was a bit surprised to see the number of empty chairs; surprised until I remembered the day of inauguration of our 44th president fell on the same day. Still for those that were in attendance, there was ample information to make the time commitment worth while.

"Moving or capable of moving with great speed or velocity; rapid; coming, happening or performed quickly or without delay." That is the definition of "Swift" in the dictionary and also the name of the Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) project in Snohomish County. June DeVoll, manager of Strategic Planning and Grants for Community Transit and the project manager for Swift, provided a briefing on the background and status of the project.

Consisting of 24 stations over 16.7 miles along SR 99 from the King/Snohomish County line to Everett, the rubber tired mode of transit will have many of the elements of rapid transit. The sleek new 60 ft articulated hybrid busses will run 10 minute, bidirectional frequencies rendering a posted schedule unnecessary. The stations will be built behind the sidewalk and include shelter from wind and rain as well as real time bus information. The sidewalk and curb will be raised to ten inches above the roadway grade to allow for an easy five and a half inch step to the 15.5 inch bus floor height.

To increase efficiency, elements that contribute to delays in service have been addressed. Off board fare collection in the form of prepaid tickets and smart cards will enable riders to board quickly from any of the three doors. The time for a wheelchair to board the bus will remain the same but the alternative ways to secure the chair within the bus will reduce delays. Of course many of the 64 traffic signals along the route running transit priority programs will also assist the reliability of the service.

The \$31,000,000 project, consisting of grants and partnerships rather than any new taxes or increased fares, is well under way in Everett and is targeted for completion sometime this summer. The first of 15 new buses will start production in February with a March delivery. The remainder of the fleet will follow in three months. A bi-weekly newsletter provides information on the project status with start up service scheduled for the fall of 2009.

Following Ms. DeVoll's presentation, section president, Nick Ching, delivered announcements. With the District Conference in Denver coming up, Mr. Ching put a call for abstracts. The next meeting will be the annual ITE/IMSA joint meeting and trade show at the Doubletree Inn in Sea-Tac. Typically a very well attended meeting, I'm sure it will be one not to miss.
